Wingham's new pipeline



Work is well underway on the new water supply pipeline for Wingham, with crews currently drilling under the Manning River at Bootawa. This replaces the original 1960s trenched pipeline that was damaged in the May flood. Since then, water to Wingham has been supplied through the Taree town network.

The new underbore pipeline will provide a flood-resilient water supply for the Wingham community.

Initial drilling is expected to wrap up in the coming weeks, reducing noise impacts for nearby residents. The full project is expected to be finished by December, weather permitting.
